## Elizabeth Bowers Zambia Education

In response to the desperate need for a secondary school in Lumwana West in NW Zambia, the Elizabeth Bowers Zambia Education Fund (EBZEF) has partnered with World Vision US to sustain and move forward our ongoing focus on the education of Beth's Girls and their community. This longheld dream of the village is now being realized as Phase I construction is well underway.

Under the auspices of World Vision Zambia, two teachers' houses are available for use in October 2016. The houses will have inside toilets and be set up for water and electricity when it is available.

Two 3-classroom blocks will be handed over in November, ready for use at the beginning of the new school year in January 2017.
